# Decision of the Independent Liquor & Gaming Authority Application for a packaged liquor licence removal – BWS – Beer Wine Spirits

We **approve** the application above under section 59 of the *Liquor Act 2007* (the Act) — with the conditions set out in Schedule 1. A revoked condition is set out in Schedule 2. The 6-hour closure period overrides any condition of the licence.

#### Statement of reasons

We are satisfied that the overall impact of approving the application will be consistent with the objects of the Act and will contribute to, not detract from, the amenity of community life.

#### Our main findings

The local community for the purposes of this decision is the suburb of Cabramatta. The broader community is the Local Government Area (LGA) of Fairfield.

The applicant is seeking to remove the BWS licence from Fairfield to the BWS premises in Cabramatta so that it can be stored in a dormant capacity in a 1m<sup>2</sup> area.

#### Social impacts

The licence may not be exercised at the proposed premises therefore no negative social impacts are associated with the removal. The licence remains subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 1.

#### The material we considered

We considered the following material when making our decision:

- the application material including evidence that stakeholders and the community were notified about the application
- the legislation
- a Statement of Risks and Potential Effects
- the plan of the licensed premises and any authorisations
- a development consent for the premises
- statistics from Liquor & Gaming NSW, Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research, NSW
  Health and Australian Bureau of Statistics on the socio-economic status, liquor licence
  density, alcohol-related crimes rates and health issues in the local and broader
  communities
- L&GNSW compliance materials
- stakeholder submissions and the applicant's response to them.

We also considered <u>Guideline 6</u> to assess the likely overall impact to the local and broader community.

This decision will be published in accordance with section 36C of the *Gaming and Liquor Administration Act* 2007.

#### Opportunity for review

The applicant and anyone who was notified of the application and made a submission, may apply to <u>NCAT</u> for a review of the decision.

An application for review must be made no later 28 days after the decision is published on the website. There is a fee to lodge the application.
