Decision of the Independent Liquor & Gaming Authority

Application for a hotel (full) licence removal – Moree Hotel

We **approve** the application above under section 59 of the *Liquor Act 2007* (the Act) — with the conditions set out in Schedule 1. Revoked conditions are set out in Schedule 2. The 6-hour closure period overrides any condition of the licence.

Statement of reasons

We are satisfied that the overall impact of approving the application will be consistent with the objects of the Act and will contribute to, not detract from, the amenity of community life.

Our main findings

The local community for the purposes of this decision is the suburb of Moree. The broader community is the Local Government Area (LGA) of Moree Plains.

The applicant seeks to remove a hotel (full) licence to an unlicensed area in the Post Office Hotel at 33 Frome Street, Moree, which is approximately 1 km from its current location. The licence will be held at the proposed premises in a dormant capacity.

Social impacts

The licence may not be exercised at the proposed premises therefore no negative social impacts are associated with the removal. The licence remains subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 1.

The material we considered

We considered the following material when making our decision:

- the application material — including evidence that stakeholders and the community were notified about the application
- the legislation
- a Statement of Risks and Potential Effects
- certificate of advertising
- the plan of the licensed premises and any authorisations
- a development consent for the premises
- licence document
- statistics from Liquor & Gaming NSW, Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research, NSW Health and Australian Bureau of Statistics on the socio-economic status, liquor licence density, alcohol-related crimes rates and health issues in the local and broader communities
- L&GNSW compliance materials
- change of boundaries approval - Post Office Hotel
- stakeholder submissions and the applicant's response to them.

We also considered [Guideline 6](#) to assess the likely overall impact to the local and broader community.

This decision will be published in accordance with section 36C of the *Gaming and Liquor Administration Act 2007*.

The applicant and anyone who was notified of the application and made a submission, may apply to [NCAT](#) for a review of the decision.

An application for review must be made no later 28 days after the decision is published on the website. There is a fee to lodge the application.

Liquor must not be sold by retail on the licensed premises for a continuous period of 6 hours between 4:00 AM and 10:00 AM during each consecutive period of 24 hours. The licensee must comply with this 6-hour closure period along with any other limits specified in the trading hours for this licence. |
| 2. | Consumption on premises | Good Friday: 12:00 noon - 10:00 PM Christmas Day: 12:00 noon - 10:00 PM (liquor can only be served with or ancillary to a meal in a dining area) December 31st: Normal opening time until normal closing time or 2:00 AM on New Year's Day, whichever is the later Note: Trading is also allowed after midnight into the early morning of Good Friday and Christmas Day if authorised by an extended trading authorisation. Trading must cease at the time specified under the authorisation. The latest time that can be specified is 5:00 AM. |
| 3. | Take away sales | Good Friday: Not permitted December 24th: Normal trading Monday to Saturday, 10:00 AM to 12:00 midnight on Sunday Christmas Day: Not permitted December 31st: Normal trading Monday to Saturday, 10:00 AM to 12:00 midnight on Sunday |
| 4. | Overall impact | The business authorised by this licence must not operate with a greater level of overall impact on the well-being of the local and broader community than what could reasonably be expected from the information contained in the application and other information submitted in the process of removing this licence to the premises at Part, 33 Frome St, Moree, NSW 2400. |
| 5. | Operation of the licence | The licence (LIQH400115954) will be held in a dormant capacity and must not be exercised at the address Part, 33 Frome Street, Moree NSW 2400. |
| 6. | No gambling activities | No gaming machines may be operated on the licensed premises. |
