STATEMENT OF REASONS

Our decision

We have considered the objects of the *Liquor Act 2007* (the Act) and the relevant legislative provisions and have approved the application under section 45 of the Act.

Overall, we are satisfied that the social impact of approving the application will not be harmful to the well-being of the local or broader community.

The decision achieves the aim of the Act to regulate the liquor industry to meet the community's expectations, needs, and aspirations, while also promoting a balanced and responsible development of the industry.

Our main findings

The local community for the purposes of this decision is Oran Park. The broader community is the Local Government Area (LGA) of Camden.

Positive social impacts

We are satisfied that the proposal would benefit the local and broader communities by providing increased convenience and choice:

- the proposed premises will adjoin a new Coles supermarket at a new development in the Oran Park Podium Shopping Centre. The centre is centrally located within proximity to commercial districts, residential housing and key road/rail links, and
- a variation of the 6-hour closure period has also been sought to align with the supermarket hours for the convenience of shoppers seeking to combine their grocery shopping and liquor purchases.

Negative social impacts

We accept that the proposal could contribute to an increase in alcohol-related harm in the local and broader communities because:

- the premises is located in a high-density hotspot for domestic assault, and medium density hotspot for non-domestic and alcohol-related assault.

However, we are satisfied that these risks are reduced by:

- crime rates in both Oran Park and the Camden LGA being lower compared to NSW for all crime categories usually considered by the Authority
- the rates of alcohol-attributable hospitalisations and deaths in the Camden LGA being lower compared to NSW
- SEIFA health data indicating above average levels of socio-economic advantage in both Oran Park and the Camden LGA compared to NSW
- saturation rates of packaged liquor licences in Oran Park and the Camden LGA being lower compared to NSW
- the harm-minimisation measures outlined in the plan of management and licence conditions, as set out in Schedule 1.

The material we considered

We considered the following material when making our decision:

- the application material — including evidence that stakeholders and the community were notified about the application
- a community impact statement (CIS)

- The plan of the licensed premises and any authorisations
- a plan of management for the licensed business
- a development consent for the premises
- statistics from Liquor & Gaming NSW, Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research, NSW Health and Australian Bureau of Statistics on the socio-economic status, liquor licence density, alcohol-related crimes rates and health issues in the local and broader communities, and
- stakeholder submissions and the applicant's response them.

We also considered [Guideline 6](#) to assess the likely social impact to the local and broader community.

**Schedule 1 – Licence conditions to be imposed
Liquorland Oran Park**

No.	Condition to be imposed	Description
1.	6-hour closure period	Section 11A of the <i>Liquor Act 2007</i> applies to this licence. Liquor must not be sold by retail on the licensed premises for a continuous period of six (6) hours between 02:00 AM and 08:00 AM during each consecutive period of 24 hours. The licensee must comply with this 6-hour closure period along with any other limits specified in the trading hours for this licence.
2.	Retail Sales	<p>Good Friday Not permitted</p> <p>December 24th Normal trading Monday to Saturday 8:00 AM to 12:00 midnight Sunday</p> <p>Christmas Day Not permitted</p> <p>December 31st Normal trading Monday to Saturday 10:00 AM to 12:00 midnight Sunday</p>
3.	Social impact	The business authorised by this licence must not operate with a greater overall level of social impact on the wellbeing of the local and broader community than what could reasonably be expected from the information contained in the Community Impact Statement, application and other information submitted in the process of obtaining this licence.
4.	Liquor Accord	The licensee or its representative must join and be an active participant in the local liquor accord.
5.	Plan of management	The premises is to be operated at all times in accordance with the Coles Liquor NSW Management Strategies and House Policy for the Responsible Service of Alcohol documents, as submitted to the Independent Liquor and Gaming Authority (“the Authority”) in support of the licence application and as may be varied from time to time after consultation with the Authority. A copy of these documents is to be kept on the premises and made available for inspection on the request of a police officer, council officer, Liquor and Gaming NSW inspector, or any other person authorised by the Authority.
6.	CCTV	<p>1) The licensee must maintain a closed-circuit television (CCTV) system on the licensed premises (“the premises”) in accordance with the following requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) the system must record continuously from opening time until one hour after the premises is required to close, (b) recordings must be in digital format and at a minimum of ten (10) frames per second, (c) any recorded image must specify the time and date of the recorded image, (d) the system’s cameras must cover the following areas: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) all entry and exit points on the premises, and (ii) all publicly accessible areas (other than toilets) within the premises. <p>2) The licensee must also:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) keep all recordings made by the CCTV system for at least 30 days, (b) ensure that the CCTV system is accessible at all times the system is required to operate pursuant to clause 1(a), by
